Mary,

I've asked Joyce Svehota to call you today to find out what's going on. Steve has acknowledged drinking problems in the past. Given tone and time of Steve's email, I'm worried. So, I'm going to try to ignore Steve's email and instead ask you to clearly state your remaining concerns to Joyce.

You and Steve *never* responded to my to recent emails about:

- royalties declining from 15% to 5%, and why I am sure that is how the contract works
- royalties due to you in response to your last email where you listed various customers from our website and said that you thought we were withholding royalties. We've sent you copies of some recent letters from Kevin and would like a response from you. Meanwhile we're still sending checks to Blueberry Software at the Concord address as instructed by Steve.

Our audit of your royalty payments has turned up some extra royalties due to you from some early customers who converted from a version of Interchange that did not include Blueberry to one that did. Joyce can provide details.
